

COURSE OUTLINE

This course is recommended by the RACGP for all doctors wanting to increase their knowledge base and clinical skills in sexual and reproductive health. CPD points are awarded

Part One: THEORY COURSE

Theory component consists of 5 consecutive days and includes topics:

- Contraception – Pill
- Everything but the Pill
- Sexual health difficulties
- Implanon insertion training
- Sexually transmitted infections
- Women's health/common gynaecology
- Older women's health
- Men's sexual health
- Infertility in general practice
- Pelvic floor dysfunction
- Multicultural issues
- Vulval problems

ASSESSMENT

The Short Answer and Role Play assessments to be held on Friday 13th July 2012. This allows completion of all segments of the theoretical course at one time.

Part Two: CLINICAL TRAINING

Clinical placement training provides the opportunity for participants to develop and apply their theoretical knowledge, practice skills, gain confidence, develop counselling and communication skills whilst under direct clinical supervision

- Clinical instruction involves 7 - 10 x 3-hour clinics. Should the experienced FPWNT trainer consider that more training is advisable further clinics will be negotiated and cost revised.

TRAINING CRITERIA

- Participants must provide photo identification. They must be qualified medical practitioners registered to practise in Australia, and members of a medical defence organisation. They must have a current NT Working with Children (Ochre) Card.

ASSESSMENT

Assessment of the clinical training is by continuous assessment and completion of a clinical practice portfolio.

CERTIFICATE

The full national *Certificate in Sexual and Reproductive Health*, recognised by the Royal Australian College of General Practitioners and the Royal Australian College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists, is awarded on completion of both theoretical and clinical aspects of the course.
