


Emergency contraception

AKA "the morning after pill"



Emergency options to prevent pregnancy after unprotected sex. Around 85% effective. Most effective when taken early.



What is emergency contraception?

Emergency contraception is used after unprotected sex. This could be:

- if you didn't use any contraception
- If you had a condom break
- If you forgot to take your oral contraceptive pill
- if you were sexually assaulted

Works by stopping or delaying ovulation. They do not cause an abortion.

What are the side effects?

Emergency contraception is very safe with no serious or long-lasting side effects. Short time side effects can include:

- breast tenderness
- nausea
- headache

Your period can change. You should do a pregnancy test if your period is more than a week late or if you have any unusual bleeding.

Types available

In Australia there are 3 types of emergency contraception available.

Levonorgestrel pill

- Available without a script from a chemist or at Family Planning
- Should be taken within 72 hours (3 days) of unprotected sex but works BEST if taken as soon as possible.
- Safe in breastfeeding

Ulipristal acetate

- Available without a script from a chemist or Family Planning.
- Should be taken within 120 hours (5 days)
 of unprotected sex. Works BEST if taken
 as soon as possible.
- If you are breastfeeding you will need to wait 1 week after ulipristal acetate before your breastmilk is safe again.

Copper IUD is another type of emergency contraception that works up to 5 days after unprotected sex. - see our Copper IUD brochure

When do I use emergency contraception?

Levonorgestrel pill= up to 72 hours after unprotected sex

Ulipristal acetate = up to 120 hours after unprotected sex

You do not need parent/guardian consent for the emergency contraceptive pill.
